Apple Crumble

Ingredients:

4 lbs. Apples (golden, honeycrisp, or rayburn)

2 tbsp. Lemon juice

3/4 tsp. ground cinnamon

2tbsp. sugar

½ tsp. salt

Topping

1 cup flour

½ tsp salt

2 tsp. water

½ tsp vanilla

½ cup brown sugar (packed)

6 tbsp. unsalted butter (melted)

½ cup almonds (finely chopped)

Preheat oven 400 degrees. Peel, core, and slice apples into ¾ "pieces. Combine lemon juice, sugar, salt, and cinnamon to apples. Put into 8x8 pan, pack apple mixture into pan. Bake on lower shelf 35 minutes.

Mix flour, brown sugar, almonds, vanilla, salt, water, butter until it looks like dough. Sprinkle on top and return to oven top shelf 30 minutes.

Let cool at least 45 minutes. Can be served with scoop of vanilla ice cream.

Death By Chocolate Cake

Ingredients:

1 box Devils food cake mix

5 eggs

1 large box chocolate instant pudding

1 tsp. vanilla

3/4 cup freshly brewed coffee

3/4 cup vegetable oil

2 cups semi-sweet chocolate chips

1 cup sour cream

Icing:

1 stick butter

2 tbsp. cocoa powder

1 tsp. vanilla

½ tbsp. milk

1 ½ cup confectioners' sugar

Pre-heat oven 350 degrees, grease bundt pan.

Mix all wet ingredients for cake together. Mix all dry ingredients for cake together (except chocolate chips). Combine both mixtures and fold chocolate chips in. Bake 45 minutes. Let cool 10 minutes before plating cake. Icing; heat butter at low heat. Stir in and mix well, cocoa powder, sugar, vanilla, and milk. Pour over warm cake. *Enjoy*

Labor History Around the Word and Across America December

12/9/1869 The Knights of Labor was founded on this date in Philadelphia as a secret society open to all members of the producing classes except "parasites" like stockbrokers, gamblers and lawyers. The Knights were one of the most important labor organizations of the late 1800s, reaching a membership of 700,000 by 1886. While other unions were fighting for a 10-hour workday, the Knights were demanding an 8-hour day, as well as an end to child and convict labor. They were also one of the earliest labor organizations to accept blacks and women. Yet they supported the Chinese Exclusion Act and participated in anti-Chinese riots. 12/30/1899 Gathering in the back room of Behrens' cigar shop in Sedalia, Mo., 33 railroad clerks form Local Lodge Number 1 of a union they named the Order of the Railroad Clerks of America. 12/15/1921 The Kansas National Guard is called out to subdue from 2,000 to 6,000 protesting women who were going from mine to mine attacking non-striking miners in the Pittsburgh coal fields. The women made headlines across the state and the nation: they were christened the "Amazon Army" by the New York Times. 12/3/1984 At least four thousand people die, and as many as 20,000, in one of the largest industrial disasters on record. It happened in Bhopal, India, when poisonous methyl isocyanate was released into the atmosphere at a Union Carbide India Limited pesticide plant. The results of investigations by Union Carbide and the government were never released to the public; one authoritative independent study laid blame at the feet of Union Carbide for its failures on training, staffing, safety and other issues 12/14/1995 33.000 members of the International Association of Machinists and Aerospace Workers ended a 69-day strike at Boeing, winning increases in pay and health benefits and job protections against subcontracting.
