Chicago Labor History for February

2/14/1910 IBEW LU 656 founded. Amalgamated with Local 134 on July 1, 1983

2/11/1920 IBEW LU 1048 founded. Defunct 4/22/1920

2/14/1980 Chicago Firefighters Union Local 2 President Frank Muscare called union members to strike at 5:15 am on February 14, 1980. The next day the city secured a back-to-work order, and on February 16 Circuit Court Judge John Hechingeterms issued contempt of court citations to union leaders, including Muscare. Muscare spent five months in Cook County Jail on contempt charges. The strike lasted 24 days with 97% of the department walking out, including seven Battalion Chiefs.

2/14/1980 Chicago Web Printing Pressmen's Union Local 7, International Typographical Union Local 16 and Chicago Mailers' Union Local 2 go on strike against the Chicago Tribune.

2/23/2012 International Ass. of Machinists Lodge 851 goes on strike against Caterpillar Inc in Joliet. The company demanded concessions while it was earning record profits and raising executive pay. The strike lasted 3 1/2 months. "It's one more small piece of evidence that the lower half of the income distribution is struggling while the people at the very top are faring quite well," says Richard Hurd, a professor of labor studies at Cornell University in Ithaca, N.Y
