Meatballs (appetizer?)

Ingredients:

1¼ lbs. ground beef (may use ground turkey)

¼ cup Italian seasoned breadcrumbs

2 tbs. parmesan cheese (grated)

1 lg. egg, beaten

1 tsp. onion powder

1 tsp. Italian seasoning

¼ tsp. garlic salt

¼ tsp black pepper

1 tsp. Worcestershire sauce

Combine all ingredients in a large bowl. Roll mixture into ½" balls (or use a small melon baller)

Fry in Olive oil until done.

Labor History Across America and Around the World **Iune**

6/2/1780 The Gordon Riots began on this date in England and lasted through June 9. The riots began as a pogrom against Catholics. However, it grew into a mass worker insurrection that included exslaves, impressed sailors and debtors, English, Irish, Italians, Germans, and Jews. The insurrectionists liberated two thousand prisoners and destroyed every major prison in London. Rioters also destroyed the homes of members of the ruling elite, as well as toll houses and the Bank of England. The rich fled the city in terror.

<u>6/2/1786</u> Twenty-six journeymen printers in Philadelphia staged the trade's first strike in America over wages: a cut in their \$6 weekly pay.

<u>6/1/1906</u> The bloody Cananea copper miners' strike began in Sonora, Mexico. The miners were demanding 5 pesos a day and an 8-hour workday, commensurate with the U.S. citizens who were working with them side-by-side. As many as 100 miners were killed.

6/1/1942 The Polish Socialist newspaper, Liberty Brigade, made the first public report that that the Nazis were gassing Jews by the thousands. In the article, they published an interview with a young Jew, Emanuel Ringelblum, who had escaped the Chelmno death camp.

<u>6/25/1994</u> Decatur, Ill., police pepper-gas workers at A.E. Staley plant gate one year into the company's two-and-a-half-year lockout of Paperworkers Local 7837.

6/16/2000 Inacom Corp., once the world's largest computer dealer, sends most of its 5,100 employees an email instructing them to call a toll-free phone number; when they call, a recorded message announces they have been fired.
