

Labor History Around the World and Across America November

11/17/1785 The General Society of Mechanics and Tradesmen was founded on this date in 1785 in a tavern in New York City. The *Society*, which still exists today, created a library, clubhouse, bank and school for their apprentices, mechanics, tradesmen and their families. 11/1/1835 In the nation's first general strike for a 10-hour day, 300 armed Irish longshoremen marched through the streets of Philadelphia calling on other workers to join them. Some 20,000 did, from clerks to bricklayers to city employees and other occupations. The city announced a 10-hour workday within the week; private employers followed suit three weeks later.

11/1/1887 Thirty-seven black striking Louisiana sugar workers are murdered when Louisiana militia, aided by bands of "prominent citizens," shoot unarmed workers trying to get a dollar-per-day wage. Two strike leaders are lynched.

11/11/1887 Haymarket martyrs hanged, convicted in the bombing deaths of eight police during a Chicago labor rally.

11/28/1908 A total of 154 men die in a coal mine explosion at Marianna, Pa. Engineer and General Superintendent A.C. Beeson tells the local newspaper he had been in the mine a few minutes before the blast and had found it to be in perfect condition.

11/7/1990 Lemuel Ricketts Boulware dies in Delray Beach, Fla., at age 95. As a GE vice president in the 1950s he created the policy known as Boulwarism, in which management decides what is "fair" and refuses to budge on anything during contract negotiations. IUE President Paul Jennings described the policy as "telling the workers what they are entitled to and then trying to shove it down their throats."
