A motor coach trip to The NBEW - IBEW Museum (The Henry Miller Museum) in St Louis MO.

The man who sparked a movement has a museum to honor his memory. At a time of terrifyingly high mortality rates and paltry pay in the new field of electrical work, Henry Miller knew what needed to be done, and he dedicated his life to making it happen. From the boarding house where he lived almost 125 years ago, the lineman founded the National Brotherhood of Electrical Workers, which would later become the International Brotherhood of Electrical Workers.

Now that modest brick house is being turned into a museum, thanks to St. Louis Local 1, the flagship union of the IBEW.

Join us as we take a motor coach to the history of our Union. Once we arrive at the museum in St Louis we will be taken on a guided tour of the Henry Miller Museum. The museum is in the very building where the NBEW was founded in 1891. The museum has displays inside and outside. There is an elevator to access the floors.

The cost \$25 per person and includes the motor coach with restroom, bottled water, coffee and doughnuts, and a box lunch.

We will leave St Louis by 4pm and should arrive back at the Hall by 9pm.

T Chicago Labor History – January

1832	The first fire company formed, they were called "The Washington Volunteers" (Exact date
unknov).

- 1870 In the early 1870s, Chicago's German furniture workers founded the first local of what became a national American furniture workers' union. (Exact date unknown)
- 1880 Chicago Musical Society was formed to represent Chicago's musicians. (Exact date unknown)
- 1891 The Chicago Musical Society joined the American Federation of Labor. (Exact date unknown)
- 01/14/1892 National Brotherhood of Electrical Workers Local Union 9 chartered.
- 1901 The Chicago Federation of Musicians Local 10 was formed. (Exact date unknown)
- 1920 The Chicago Federation of Musicians Local 208 was formed for the African American's that were not allowed to join Local 10. (exact date unknown) In 1966 the discrimination was ended when CFM Local 10 and Local 208 merged to form CFM Local 10-208.

- 01/01/1914 Amalgamated Clothing Workers of America founded. Date approximate.
- 01/17/1915 Anarchist and organizer Lucy Parsons led hunger march.
- 01/17/1915 Eighty thousand Chicago construction workers strike.
- 01/29/1916 IBEW Local 214 founded.
- 01/22/1920 IBEW Local 1030 founded. Defunct
- 01/09/1922 Chicago gravediggers go on strike for better pay, an eight hour work day, and union recognition.
- 01/01/1933 Farm Equipment Workers Organizing Committee founded. Exact date is not clear. (For an in-depth study of the FEWOC check out The Long Deep Grudge by Toni Gilpin.)
- 01/22/1937 Little steel strike. Chicago and throughout the Midwest and Northeast region of the United States. Close to Thirty mills were affected. The strike lasted five months.
- 01/01/1938 Packinghouse Workers Organizing Committee officially became the United Packinghouse Workers of America. (exact date unknown)
- 01/21/1941 IBEW Local 1220 founded.
- 01/14/1953 IBEW Local 334 founded. Defunct 08/30/1957
- 01/01/1956 IBEW Local 1864 founded. Defunct
- 01/01/1972 Chicago Committee on Occupational Safety and Health founded. (Date approximate)
- 01/30/1986 Gravediggers SEIU L.U. 106 go on strike and then were locked out.
- 01/30/1992 Workers at V & V Supremo go on strike for Union representation and better wages. (date is approximate)
- 01/11/2003 US Labor Against the War formed in Chicago.
