#### FROM THE PODIUM

#### Doublethink

In 1949, George Orwell published his novel,

"1984." In this story, Orwell laid out a government strategy that used various means and physiological processes to enslave its citizenry. By subjecting its people to a constant barrage of contradictory propaganda, the government used something Orwell called doublethink such as: freedom is slavery; war is peace; and knowledge is ignorance. You may question where the hell I am going with this. As farfetched as this sci-fi novel may appear, it is not as outrageous as it seems. During the Viet Nam War, the term invasion was changed to incursion. The latest change, racism and intolerance, has been changed to alt-right. This brings me to my latest rant, the use of doublethink where the term 'right to work for less' has been changed to 'the right to work.' The phrase right to work sounds very righteous and pro-worker. Let's take a closer

Under federal law, no one can be forced to join a union as a condition of employment. The Supreme Court has also made it clear that workers cannot be forced to pay dues that are used for political purposes. So-called right-to-work legislation goes one step further and entitles employees to the benefits of a union contract, including the right to have the union

take up their grievance (at no cost to the employee) if their employer abuses them.

This means that if an employer mistreats a worker who does not pay a union representation fee, the union must resolve that worker's grievance just as it would a duespaying member, even if it costs tens of thousands of dollars. Non-duespaying workers would also receive the higher wages and benefits their dues-paying coworkers enjoy. Right-to-work laws have nothing to do with whether people can be forced to join a union or contribute to a political cause they do not support; that is already illegal. Nor does the right-to-work law have anything to do with the right to have a job or be provided employment. This law is only a blatant attack on unions and working people. Whether you call it 'talking points,' or doublethink, question Big Brother. He's watching.

#### RECIPE EXCHANGE

1/8 tsp. ground nutmeg

I was given this recipe by Laura Felde, and I have not tried it yet but it sounded too good to pass up.

#### BUTTERNUT SQUASH SOUP

4 cups vegetable broth 12 oz butternut squash, peeled and cut into 1-1-1/2 inch cubes 1/2 large vidalia onion, cut into 2 in.cubes 1/2 small apple, peeled and cut into 2 in. cubes 1/4 tsp. salt 1/8 tsp. pepper

In a large stock pot, combine broth, squash, onion, and apple; cover pot and bring to a boil over high heat to low; gently simmer until squash is very tender, about 10 minutes. Puree soup in pot using a blender in batches; be careful not to splatter the hot liquid. Season with salt, pepper and nutmeg. Yields eight 3/4 cup servings.
