### May 13 2015 Speakers

We were privileged to have both the new business manager Don Finn and EIT fund administrator Sean Madix this month. Don as you may know has taken over after the untimely death of Terry Allen. Sean on the other hand has been the head of EIT for the past 20 years; he was instrumental in the modernization of the fund office. At last month's meeting there were concerns as to the health of our pensions so we asked if they could address these issues.

Our pension is currently 93% funded which is better than any other local building trade, IBEW or otherwise, also better funded than NEBF. It was also asked if we had any issues similar that sheet metal LU #73 had with overpayments. Sean assured us that due to the methods and scrutiny paid to our calculations as well as the simplicity of our plan that this cannot happen.

As to the overall health of our plans, Sean first reminded us to the fact that <u>all trustees</u>, have a <u>fiduciary</u> responsibility to us the participants to insure that the plan is properly administered. The trust also looks on a long range picture in its investments and is well diversified to accept

market fluctuations. The trustee's regularly are advised by professional tinancial consultants and tund managers who are well aware of multi employer plans like ours.

Sean briefly addressed some health plan questions; (1) our pharmacy costs have increased approximately 12 ½% year over year. (2) Drug companies are spending more today on mapping DNA and creating cures rather than "block buster" drugs. (3) People are living longer. We are the only plan that provides a health plan at no cost to retirees. (4) The time will come when we will make some type of payment for the plan. This will be in the future.

Questions directed to Don Finn were, (1) the possibility of retirees working, at this time the answer is no there are still 700+ on the book however it is improving. (2) will we ever see a 13<sup>th</sup> check, this is being discussed and Don's promise is that if and when it happens all fixed plan members will get a check not just Pension Plan 2. No Promises were made but they are talking.

### RECIPE EXCHANGE

### AMBROSIA - serves 4 to 6

1 - 20 oz. can chunk pineapple

1-11 oz. can mandarin orange segments

11/2 cup seedless grapes

1 cup miniature marshmallows

1 cup flaked coconut

½ cup nuts

3/4 cup sour cream

1 tbsp. sugar

Drain the pineapple and oranges segments and combine with grapes, coconut, marshmallows and nuts. Mix sour cream and sugar. Stir sour cream and sugar mixture into the fruit mixture. Chill and enjoy!


