August 12 2015 Speaker

Before I begin, I wish to congratulate two members that were left out of last month's newsletter, they are Albert Malchiodi 55years and Donald Mahoney 65years. My apologies to these gentlemen.

Our August speaker is the Honorable Michael B. Betar, a Lake County judge who is involved with **The**Veterans History Project. (VHP)

This group takes applications from vets all over the area and then they host a breakfast at the Lake County Court house. The specialty is SOS, bacon, eggs, coffee all donated by a local farmer. They also have a speaker; last year was a Medal Of Honor Recipient.

The vet is then paired with a judge and taken to a courtroom where a court reporter will transcribe the vet's story. Afterward the vet is sent a copy of the report along with a plaque. The complete transcription is then sent to the Library of Congress American Folk life Center for a permanent record. They are attempting to reach as many WWH and Korean War vets as they can first, although all are welcome. The stories can range from general to very personal.

Many children of the veterans have stated that they had never heard of some of these stories before. Many who have served, especially in wartime, do not talk about what they have seen and hold it inside.

If you are a vet or have a vet who would like to relate their time in the service you may register online at www.loc.gov/vets. You can print the Field Kit or see and hear stories and histories for yourselves.

Remember not all of us were in combat but we were in a supporting role. It was a story of our lives and perhaps one you may think is worth preserving.

I thank every vet for his service and proudly stand with all of you.

RECIPE EXCHANGE

The morning I planed on baking this cake, I made an extra cup of coffee to use in this recipe. It does add to the batter and taste.

APPLE CAKE

Preheat oven 350 degrees. Grease and flour a 9x13 pan. Bake for 45 minutes

MIX WELL

3/4 cup melted margarine

1 ½ cup sugar

2 well beaten eggs

2 1/4 cups flour

1/2 tsp. salt

1 1/2 tsp. baking soda

3/4 cup left over coffee

1 tsp. vanilla

ADD

3 cups unpeeled chopped apples
TOPPING TO SPRINKLE ON TOP

MIX TOGETHER

½ cup brown sugar

1 tsp. cinnamon

½ cup shopped nuts
