FROM THE PODIUM State of our Unions

On Monday, March 9th President Obama released a statement saying he was "deeply disappointed that a new anti-worker law in Wisconsin will weaken, rather than strengthen workers in this economy."

In his statement on the Wisconsin law, Obama said that "it's inexcusable that, over the past several years, just when middle-class families and workers need that kind of security the most, there's been a sustained, coordinated assault on unions, led by powerful interests and their allies in government and" That this "sustained, coordinated assault" is worthy of notice.

White House principal deputy press secretary Eric Schultz told reporters the next day aboard Air Force One. "Instead of rolling back workers' rights, states, including Wisconsin, should be expanding workers' rights, like raising the minimum wage and paid sick leave, Unions are suing to block Wisconsin's newest anti-union law. Can you remember Tuesday June 2nd 1981, thousands of Local 134 members sacrificed a days pay to protest in Springfield. Governor Thompson said that he wouldn't sign any anti union

legislation that crossed his desk. He kept his word.

Life Insurance Choices!

Sometime in April you will receive a ballot from Local 134
to vote on the MetLife life insurance benefit for active and retired members.
The ballot has three options:

1.*AP \$60,**Q \$15; no change to payout - \$7500 active and retirees, at 65 it drops to \$5000, at 70 it drops to \$3750

2.*AP \$132,**Q \$33; active and retirees same payout - \$7500

3.*AP\$133,**Q\$33.25; active payout \$10,000; retirees - \$7500

In my opinion vote for option (2) because option (1) we have already.

Option (2) is the only one that will benefit active and retirees equally.

Option (3) is a two-tier choice that does not offer an equitable payout to all who participate in the insurance plan.

Active and retiree members will both benefit in the end with option (2).

RECIPE EXCHANGE

ONE SKILLET SPAGHETTI FOR TWO

½ pound lean ground beef

1 small onion chopped

1 can (14-1/2 oz) diced tomatoes, undrained

1/3 cup chopped green pepper

4 to 6 tablespoons water

½ teaspoon salt

½ teaspoon chili powder

3 ounces uncooked spaghetti, broken

1/3 cup shredded cheddar cheese

In a large skillet, cook beef and onion over medium heat until meat is no longer pink; drain. Stir in the tomatoes, green pepper, water, salt, chili powder and spaghetti. Bring to a boil. Reduce heat; cover and simmer for 30 minutes or until spaghetti is tender, stirring frequently and adding more water if necessary. Sprinkle with cheese; cover and heat until cheese is melted, about 5 minutes.

It looks easy enough and I am sure you could add more spaghetti and more canned tomatoes if you like.



WHEN APPROACHING FROM DOWNTOWN CHICAGO: Take the Elsenhower Expressway (1-290) West to the East-West Tollway (1-88), Aurora exit. immediately after paying the \$.40 foll at the Cermak Road/22nd Street follbooth, exit Right and proceed North on Spring Road to DRURY LANE.

WHEN APPROACHING FROM THE WEST ON L-88: Exit at Midwest Road, turn Right, proceed North to Butterfield Road (Route 56). Turn right onto Butterfield Road, exit Rosevelt Road (Route 38) East to DRURY LANE.

WHEN APPROACHING FROM I-294 (TRI-STATE): to I-88 (East-West Tollway) West, to Aurora exilt. Immediately after paying \$.40 toll at Cermak Road/22nd Street tollbooth, exit Right and proceed North on Spring Road to DRURY LANE.
